

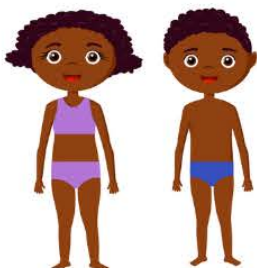
Trafficking & Grooming: How to Keep Children Safe

No!



Teach children to say “NO”

When it comes to their body, children must understand it is ok to say no.... even to adults and family members.



Private areas are private

Private areas are covered by swimming costumes. No one should see, touch, or take a photo of these areas. Also, no one should show a child a photo, or have them see, or touch a private area.



3-5 Trusted adults

Make sure children know of trusted adults they can talk to about *anything*. Most sexual abuse and grooming is done by people the child knows. Therefore a wide variety of trusted adults is recommended.



No secrets

Teach children that as soon as someone asks them to keep a secret they must always tell a trusted adult.



No private screen time

When children are on a screen it needs to be easily visible to the parent/guardian. No online safety tool can keep kids 100% safe. Only you can!
